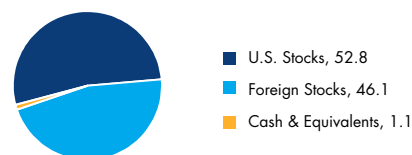
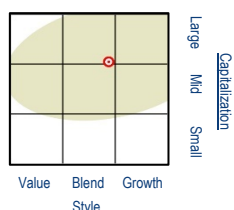

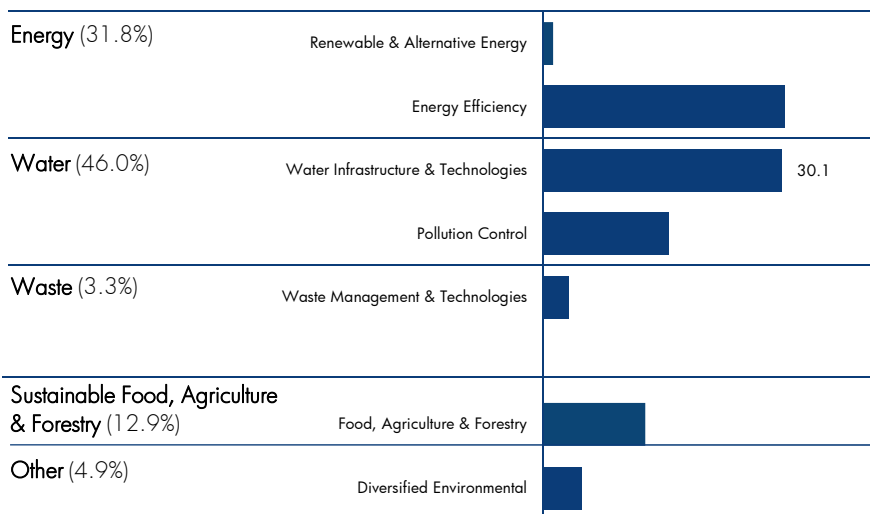
**Morningstar Style Box**<sup>§</sup> as of 03/31/17

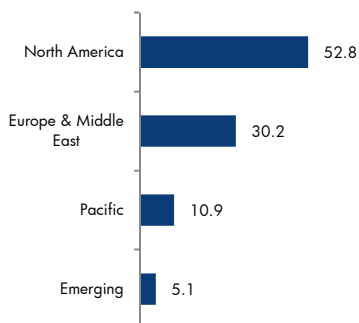
